Here's the full constellation map for The Wizard's Sleeve. A few things to know:

The two axes are the important ones for guests: left to right goes from dry and bitter through to sweet and fruity, and top to bottom goes from light and refreshing down to strong and boozy. The four quadrant names (Crisp Openers, Light & Fun, The Dark Arts, Dangerous Territory) give guests an immediate read on where they want to be on a given night.

Drinks in the same category are connected by dashed constellation lines, so you can see how the families cluster. The Spirit-Forward drinks form a tight constellation down in The Dark Arts corner, the spritzes cluster light and left, and the sweet late-night drinks drift rightward into Dangerous Territory. Hover any dot on desktop to see the drink name and one-liner. On mobile, tap to open and tap again to close.

A few things I could adjust if you want: the positions of any drinks that feel wrong to you, the quadrant names if you want something more on-brand or funnier, or the overall size and label density. Let me know.
